Ms. Holloway earned her undergraduate degree in Education from Villanova University in 1976 and a Master of Science degree in Counseling and Human Relations from Villanova in 1984. As an active member of the community, Holloway spent 11 years serving on the board of directors for Main Line Health and chaired the governance committee during her tenure. In recognition of her dedicated service, Holloway has received several awards, including receiving papal honors from Pope Francis and being named to the pontifical Order of St. Gregory as a Dame of St. Gregory, the single highest honor the Holy Father can bestow on an individual. In 2008, the Augustinians of the Province of St. Thomas of Villanova, of the order of St. Augustine, made her a member of the Augustinian Order. She has also received the Blue Torch Award from After School All Stars, the volunteerism award from St. Mary Magdalen, and the St. Augustine Alumnae Award from Villanova University. Patricia was also inducted into the Villa Maria Hall of Fame.

Patricia received The Immaculata Medal in recognition of her public service and creative leadership in the community. Most recently The Association of The Fundraising Professionals - Greater Philadelphia Chapter (AFP-GPC), named Patricia the Outstanding Fundraising Volunteer of the Year.
