A groundbreaking ceremony at Holy Family Home will take place following Mass.

The Little Sisters of the Poor embark on a journey to rebuild their Home for Philadelphia's elderly poor. Continuing the mission of their Foundress Saint Jeanne Jugan, the Little Sisters of the Poor welcome the needlest elderly of every race and religion, offering them a home where they will be welcomed as Christ, cared for as family, and accompanied with dignity until God calls them to himself.

The Little Sisters of the Poor have partnered with The Catholic Foundation of Greater Philadelphia to raise the funds needed to rebuild Holy Family Home. The new Home will comfortably accommodate 15 Little Sisters and 55 residents. Its design will allow the Little Sisters of the Poor to introduce a new model of care, enabling residents to "age in place" in apartments for as long as possible before transferring to a care household if a higher level of care is needed. This approach responds to the desire of seniors to remain as independent and active as possible as they age and to the conviction of the Little Sisters that old age is a meaningful stage of life, not an illness.

To conclude the morning, The Little Sisters of the Poor will hold a reception in Holy Family Home's Social Hall.
